

Defensive Dual Index Plan (UK and US) Issue 32

The Plan provides the potential to receive capital growth of 8.5% p.a. depending on the performance of the FTSE 100 Index and the S&P 500 Index.

The full Investment Term is six years. However, the Plan has the potential to mature early (kick-out) and pay back Initial Capital plus a defined capital growth amount on any anniversary date from the second year onwards. If, on any anniversary from year two, both the FTSE 100 Index and the S&P 500 Index are at or above their Initial Index Levels, the Plan will close and return Initial Capital plus 8.5% capital growth for each year that has elapsed.

Where the Plan has not closed early and runs to the full six year term, the required kick-out levels reduce to 75% of their Initial Index Levels on the Investment End Date.
